


Answer the Call of a Nursing Career

Admission Requirements

- Must hold a bachelor's degree in any field from a regionally accredited college or university and must have earned a GPA of at least 3.0 on a 4.0 scale during the last 60 credits of your program
- Transcripts from all undergraduate educational institutions attended, showing an undergraduate GPA of 3.0 or higher
- Complete criminal background check clearances and drug screening (carried out within three months prior to admission)
- Proof of current AHA Basic Life Support certification
- A completed Department of Nursing health form and physical examination

As part of your bachelor's degree program, you must also prove you have completed the following prerequisite courses within the last seven years and with a grade of C (2.0) or higher:

- Human Anatomy & Physiology I (with laboratory component)
- Human Anatomy & Physiology II (with laboratory component)
- Microbiology (with laboratory component)
- Chemistry
- Nutrition
- Statistics
- Developmental Psychology

Applicants missing prerequisite courses are required to take or re-take them prior to beginning Entry Level MSN courses.
