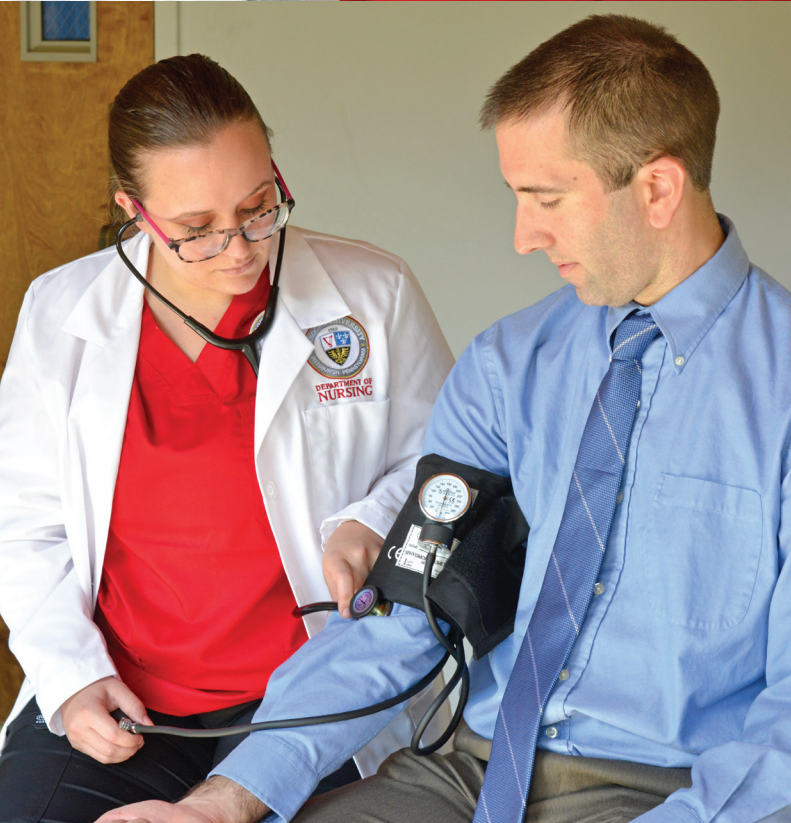

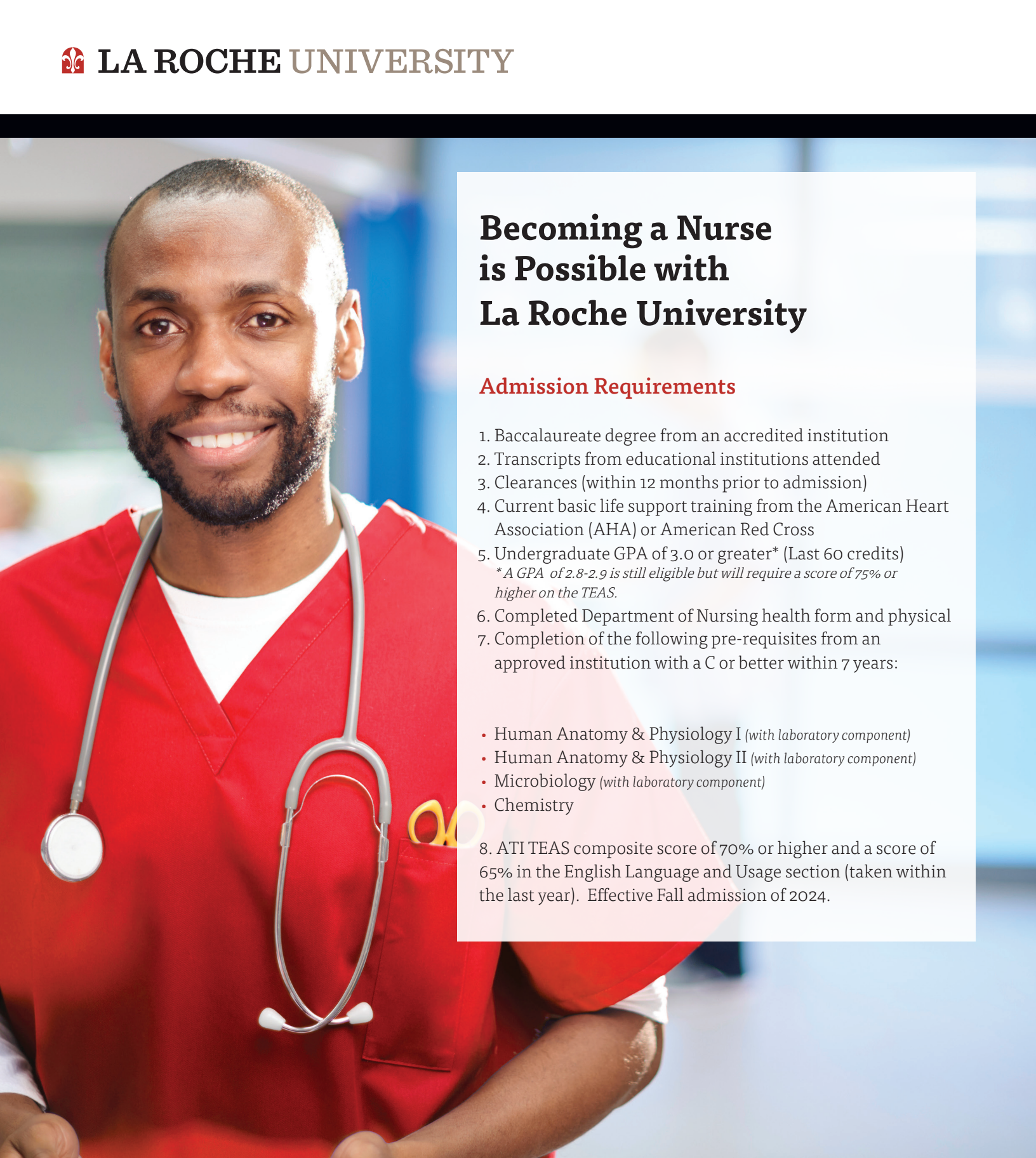

Admission Requirements

1. Baccalaureate degree from an accredited institution
2. Transcripts from educational institutions attended
3. Clearances (within 12 months prior to admission)
4. Current basic life support training from the American Heart Association (AHA) or American Red Cross
5. Undergraduate GPA of 3.0 or greater* (Last 60 credits)
**A GPA of 2.8-2.9 is still eligible but will require a score of 75% or higher on the TEAS.*
6. Completed Department of Nursing health form and physical
7. Completion of the following pre-requisites from an approved institution with a C or better within 7 years:

- Human Anatomy & Physiology I (with laboratory component)
- Human Anatomy & Physiology II (with laboratory component)
- Microbiology (with laboratory component)
- Chemistry

8. ATI TEAS composite score of 70% or higher and a score of 65% in the English Language and Usage section (taken within the last year). Effective Fall admission of 2024.
